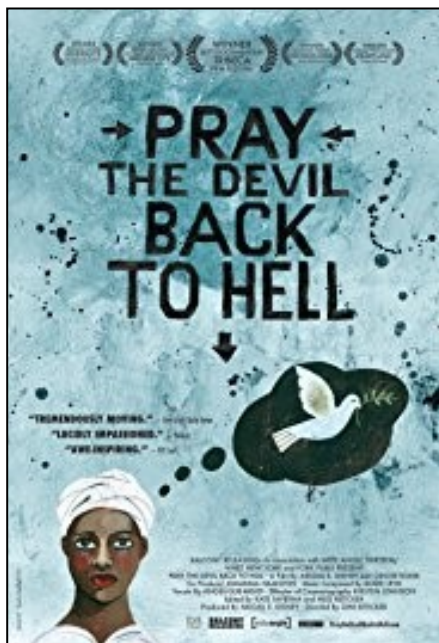

Pray the Devil Back to Hell

Sunday, October 8, 3:00-5:30pm

The astonishing true story of Liberian women who took on the warlords of their country and the regime of a dictator in the midst of a brutal civil war and won an unimaginable peace for their shattered country.

In 2003, as the rebel nooses tightened around the capital of Monrovia, thousands of women – ordinary mothers, grandmothers, aunts and daughters, Christians and Muslims – formed a thin but unshakeable line between the opposing forces.

Armed only with white t-shirts and courage, they faced down killers who had turned Liberia into hell on earth.

Movement co-leader Leymah Gbowee was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2011 for her courageous work, mobilizing the women of her country.

In Israel-Palestine today, women from all sides of the conflict are coming together in the spirit of the women of Liberia.
